PAPER - I MICRO ECONOMIC ANALYSIS-I Marks: 50

Theory of Consumer behavior: - A Critique of the cardinal approach & Indifference Curve approach, splitting of price effects into income and substitution effects - Hick Vs Slutsky theorem. Revealed preference theory, Revision of demand theory by Hicks, Consumer's Surplus - Marshallian and Hicksian approach.

Theory of Product behavior:-

Production function:- Types of Production function - Homogeneous production function, Cobb - Douglas Production function and its Properties, Laws of returns and Returns to scale, Isoquant and isocost, optimal combination of resources, expansion path - Linear programming in the context of maximization of profit and minimization of cost.

Theory of Product Pricing:-

Perfect Competition: - Equilibrium of firm and industry, Price determination, output determination under perfect competition under both identical as well as differential cost conditions.

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ENGLISH (P.G.)**Course Structure**

In each theory paper there shall be four units, and the question paper shall have one question from each unit with an alternative option. Out of the two alternatives of any question, at least one shall be long answer type and its alternative may be long answer type or short answer type. In Semester-II, Paper-X is meant to test the ability of the student in presenting seminars and writing term papers, to be evaluated by viva-voce. In Semester IV, the students shall have to write a dissertation under the guidance of the course teacher on a topic assigned by the Head of the Department, and the same shall be evaluated by a viva-voce.
